

DRAMA, DANCE AND ARTS ARTS CENTER / MEDOFF THEATER

New 100,000-SF Arts Complex houses a 430-seat proscenium theater with two balconies, a double-height rehearsal hall/dance studio, classrooms and offices for the theater, dance and art departments. The new building is the result of a partnership between the University and the community and serves both academic and community with cultural events and educational activities.

The Mark and Stephanie Medoff Theater includes a 30-seat orchestra pit. Acoustics environment is supported by a quiet under-floor displacement air distribution system and sound-diffusive custom-pleated metal fabric balcony fronts enhance the sense of envelopment without compromising speech intelligibility. Sophisticated AV systems offer flexible sound and video projection to support a wide variety of theatrical productions. Space aesthetics are topped with a magnificent ceiling mural painted by artist Meg Seligman which reflects the rich landscape of Las Cruces.

The Hershel Zohn Rehearsal Hall is a double-height multi-use space with fullheight curtainwalls offering stunning mountain views. Their sloped shape provides acoustic control and is supplemented by floor-to-ceiling adjustable curtains. 8-foot high fully-mirrored moveable panels can be deployed along two side of the room for dancers, or stored for drama rehearsal.
