\$26 M renovation and expansion project for 84,000-SF building achieves a setting stressing educational efficiency through technology. In addition to shaping life opportunities for students, the Center upholds a commitment to serving economic and cultural development for the central Pennsylvania region. Building components include:

- An acoustically flexible, intimate 300-seat concert hall
- 18 sound-isolated teaching studios that centralize music faculty in a single location when previously scattered around campus
- 6 new and 17 upgraded sound-isolated practice rooms
- 1600-SF state-of-the-art electronic Yamaha keyboard studio
- 3500-SF highly flexible recital/rehearsal space
- 1300-SF multi-purpose room with dance floor, mirrors, bar and natural light
- Modernized 700-seat multi-purpose Lyte Auditorium featuring superb sound system to accommodate theatrical productions
- Recording studio with isolated sound booth and connectivity to rehearsal and performance spaces
- Provided assessment, planning, design and support through construction
